Child Protection Inspection:

Coosan NS recently had an inspection in the area of Child Protection. The inspection involved interviews with the principal (Designated Liaison Person), Chairperson of the BOM and some staff members from the whole school staff as well as surveying parents and pupils. School records were also examined. Following the completion inspection it was confirmed that the school is compliant in all areas. The inspectors were keen to highlight that it was very evident that there is amazing work being done in the school in the area of child protection and that everyone should be commended for their respective roles. Well done everyone, a great achievement.

New Chromebooks:
