Dear Parent(s)/Guardians,

Appreciation:

We wish to thank you for having the children so well prepared for school and for the effort you have put into getting uniforms ready, labelling items, ensuring children have healthy lunches, tying back hair, getting children to school on time etc.

Uniform:

Please note the following regarding your child's uniform and appearance at school:

- Pupils must come to school in full uniform, clean and tidy.
- No jewellery is allowed except a watch, single pair of small earnings (i.e. ear studs or sleepers, one in each earlobe).
- Facial piercings are not permitted.
- No make-up or fake tan may be worn.
- Pupils with long hair are expected to wear it tied up, in a neat and tidy fashion (not obstructing vision), with no unnatural colours allowed.
- Shorts of an appropriate length and a single colour in keeping with the school uniform are permitted especially when the weather is nice.



Health & Safety:

In the interests of all pupils health and safety we kindly ask everyone to remember:

If pupils are unwell, please do not send them to school consult your gp, follow public health advice and inform the school so that we can support your child in the case of a long period of absence and when they return to school.

We have children with a variety of allergies attending our school the school kindly asks that treats are not sent in for the whole class as a birthday celebration and wish to remind everyone that foods with trace elements of nuts are not allowed due to severe nut allergies in our school.

Chewing gum is not permitted in Coosan N.S.. The school would appreciate the support of parents/guardians in ensuring that it does not come into school-Go raibh maith agaibh.

Assemblies:

Our school assemblies take place in the school GP Hall on Tuesdays (JI-2nd classes & pupils from our SEU) and Thursdays (3rd-6th classes & pupils from our SEU). These provide a lovely opportunity for pupils to meet together, to share important information and to celebrate special events.

Schoolyard Activities:

After the Halloween break, we will begin to roll out the next stage of our yard games initiatives. In the first term, the soccer league took place and sports equipment was available on the senior yard. Behind the scenes, an extensive list of suitable yard games has been sourced for our school. The equipment for these games is now subdivided into storage boxes for the 8 types of games. External storage was bought, constructed and is on site ready to go. The 5th and 6th Class teachers have been using their PE time to teach a selected list of yard games. The senior students have been practising coaching these games on one another. A list of volunteers from the 5th and 6th Classes is being drafted. There will be a rota of these students going to the various yards to help the younger classes play these games, allowing for the development of leadership skills in our senior students. This will happen two days a week, Tuesday and Thursdays. Over time we will expand further as children become familiar with the various games. Our target yard for the next term will be 1st and 2nd. We will expand to the other yards in stages after this. The children will have two weeks on one type of game- for example skipping ropes (getting four sessions learning various skipping rope games). Then after two weeks, they may have ball games-(dodgeball for example) and this continues to rotate so as to keep it fresh for the children. We hope this will enrich the children's play time along with the various other activities that will be available on alternative days to the yard activities.

Lunchtime Activities:

After Mid-Term Break, we will be introducing a range of fun lunchtime activities. Chess will be offered to 6th class pupils initially, led by Ms. Crowley. Kids Yoga will also be offered to pupils in 2nd class, led by Ms. Whyte. A creative kids club will also begin, led by Ms. Beirne. Hurling and Football will continue on the pitch coached by Mr.Ronaldson, Mr Keogh, Mr.Cunningham, Mr. Broderick, Mr Kenny, Ms O'Donohue and Ms. Brophy. Our School Music group will also continue next term with Ms. Harney and Ms. Crowley. Lunchtime breaks are certain to be a hive of activity with something for everyone to enjoy.

Outside Coaches:

Basketball and GAA coaching continues next term. All pupils in the school will receive basketball, Gaelic Football and hurling coaching over a 7/8-week period at different intervals throughout the school year. Curriculum lessons being taught by your child's teacher every week.
